

Responder's Site User Manual

Version 1.3


This version of the Responder's Site User Manual supports the first phase of development for this application. The Responder's Site is intended to allow first responders and other agencies access to SunGuide cameras. The first phase of development included the following.

- Allow easy access to cameras.
- Provide quick updated snapshots.
- Allow up to 4 cameras selected.
- Provide a login page with password.

Subsequent phases of development will include functions such as access to SunGuide event data, improved graphical user interface (GUI), continued enhancement of video quality, and enhanced user interaction with the application. As new phases of the application are released, a new companion version of this user manual will be developed.

Login

To login, go to site: <http://responders.sunguide.info/> and enter your username and password

If this is the first time logging into the Responder's Site, use the default password provided in the welcome email. User will be prompted to change the password. Passwords must be at least 8 characters long.



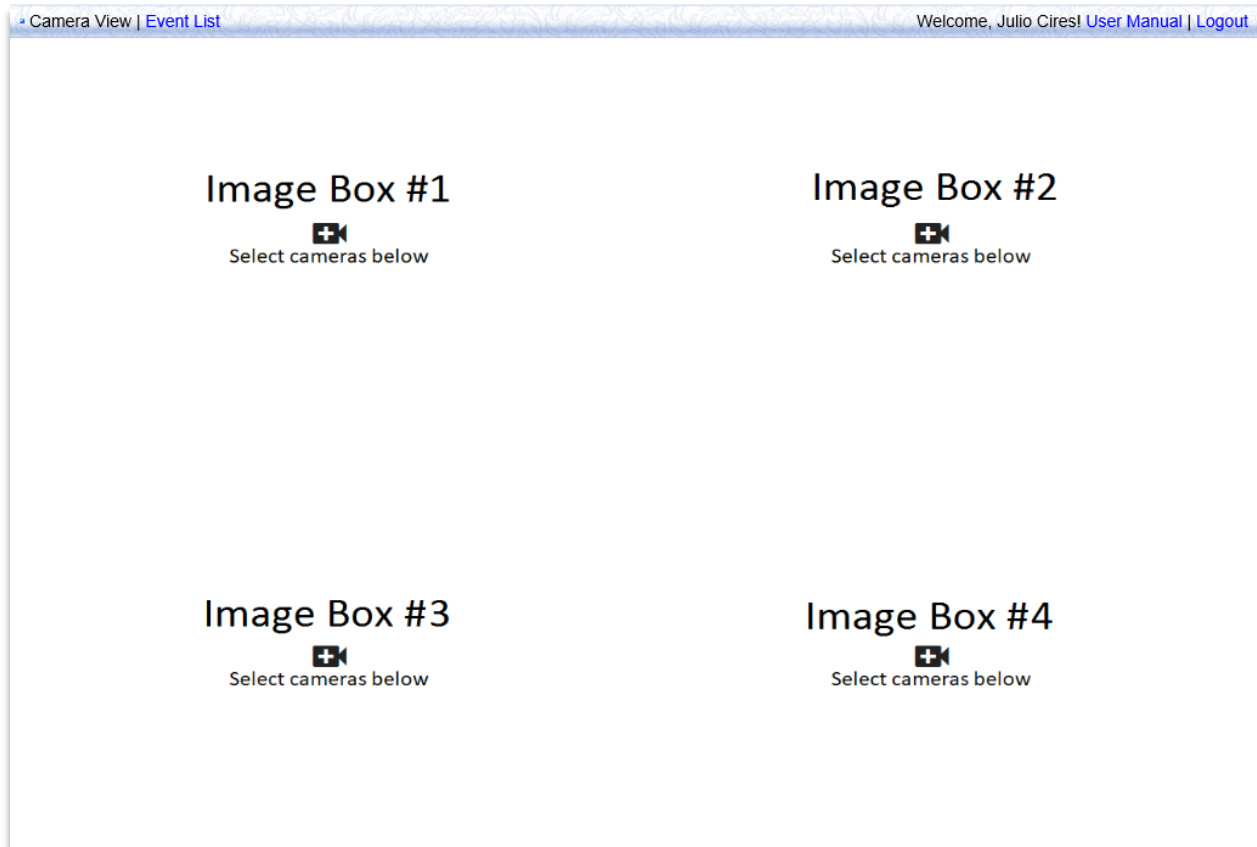

Once user login or initial password change is completed successfully, the user will be redirected to the Camera View page.

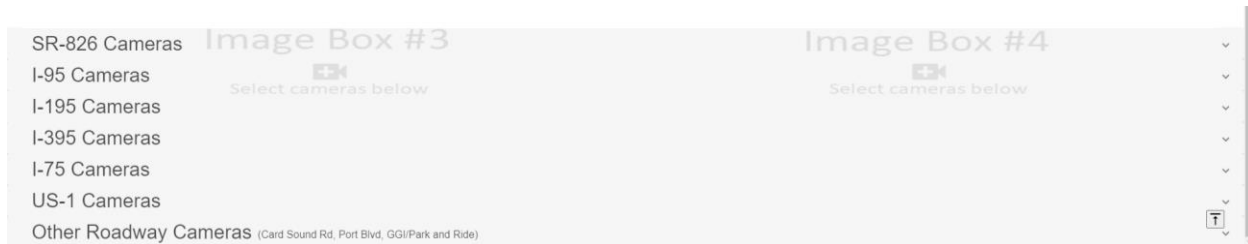
Camera View Page

Once the camera view page has loaded, a navigation bar at the top will provide a logout button and navigation in between the “Camera View” page and “Event List” page. The user manual is also accessible at any time by clicking the “User Manual” link.

Below this, four sections are available for camera display and selection.

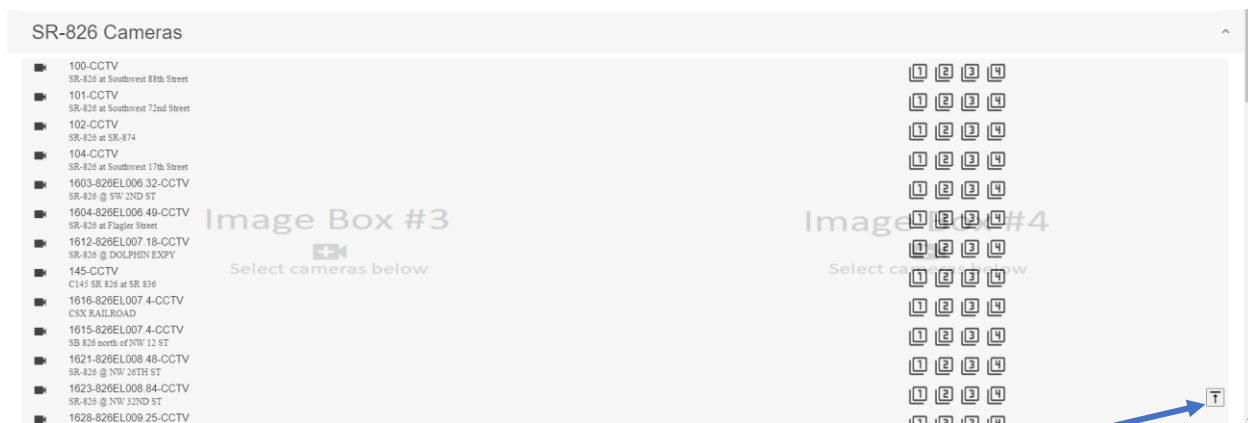



To display cameras' images, scroll down to see the list of available cameras, which will be grouped by roadway. Clicking on any group will expand the list of cameras on that roadway, and clicking an expanded group, inversely, will collapse it.



To display a camera, find the desired camera on the list and click on the corresponding button where you want the camera to be displayed.

1. Top left
2. Top right
3. Bottom left
4. Bottom right



To return to the top of the page at any time, click the  button

Cameras will refresh periodically and can be changed at any time.



Event List

An event list with all current active D6 SunGuide events can be accessed at any time by clicking on the “Event List” link on the navigation bar.

Events are separated into two groups: events with active lane blockages and those without. The event list will refresh periodically.


Logout


After successfully logging out, a confirmation will be shown to confirm it is safe to close/leave the site.

If the user forgets the password, click the “Forgot Password” link on the login page.




